Dear Joy-Abounders:

We have passed the 24-hour mark after Peter's massive open heart surgery. He did well overnight but was still coming out of the affects of anesthesia. By mid morning his speech had improved and he was able to pass a swallowing evaluation and eat a light breakfast. They have removed some of his monitoring lines and he sat up in chair for a short period of time. The plan is to ambulate (walk) him this afternoon. Chest tubes are still in place for another day or two. Also, an external temporary pacemaker is controlling his heart rate at the moment, which is normal for his surgery. Again, these next few hours and days are crucial. Please continue to pray:

- *Increased strength and for the anesthesia effects to wear off*
- *Minimal pain, so far his pain is managed*
- *No nausea, so far he has had none*
- *Minimal bleeding from chest tubes, so far so good*

Overall Peter is exactly on schedule and all is going well or better than expected for this type of massive open heart surgery. Let's stay vigilant! Please also pray for the family for strength and rest.
