The next two prayer focuses are another step in that direction.

TEACHING NOTES for Saturday, February 6

Practical training for ministry. For a long time churches across the board assumed that in order to be an ordained minister you had to graduate from Bible school or theological seminary. Back in the 1950s Doris and I dutifully attended these schools in order to become foreign missionaries. It worked out well, but after we had been on the field for a while it occurred to us that hardly anything we had studied could be applied directly to missionary service.

Things really got complicated when we began planting churches in the Andes Mountains where the obvious anointed leader of the new church was a man who had a family, who had a job, who was a respected member of his community, and who obviously could not go to the city for three years to attend Bible school. Could he be ordained as pastor of the new church? It seemed like some kind of paradigm shift was becoming necessary.

The outcome was some of us beginning to develop a new kind of school adapted to the needs of this new, mature kind of pastor. The one I am most closely associated with is Wagner Leadership Institute. We offer bachelor, masters, and doctorate to students who never have to leave their homes and live somewhere else for their courses. We are more geared to practical aspects of ministry instead of only Bible content and theology and church history. This is training for the army of God that will move forward to transform the world and bring the kingdom of God. Today let's pray for this army and also for what role God has for you in helping to advance His kingdom.

TEACHING NOTES for Sunday, February 7

Pragmatic Evangelism. Back in the days when we first went to the mission field, we had been taught that our job would be to preach the good news of salvation to as many people as possible and leave the results up to God. As I began to see the big picture, however, I observed for one thing that some people, preaching the same gospel, would habitually see a larger number of those who heard become saved than other preachers would. This suggested that, in effect, some evangelism was more effective than others. This, then, leads us to agree that the real goal of evangelism is not just to preach, but to actually harvest souls and measure effectiveness by numbers saved.

Such a thought upsets many people, especially evangelists who enjoy preaching, but who have such poor results that they don't want anyone counting. In quite a few cases "leave the results to God" is not a spiritual principle, but merely a cop-out. It becomes a shield to protect incompetent evangelists. We need to pray that leaders will be willing to set goals for their undertakings and measure whether or not they have attained those goals.

I like to call this focus on results "pragmatic" evangelism. I'm sorry that some people feel that pragmatism can't be spiritual. It can be spiritual, and in fact without a pragmatic approach we cannot make much progress in our goal of transformation. Let's renew our minds.
